The Louisville Story Program is a literary arts outreach nonprofit and publisher that provides historically underrepresented Louisvillians with the tools and resources required to tell the stories of their lives in their own words and document their communities from the inside out.

- Historical research
- Interview transcription and editing
- Publication assistance and data entry in a digital archive
- Operations support with retail outreach and fulfillment
- Supporting curricula content creation
- Data evaluation
- Media operations
- Facilitating placement of publications in stories, libraries, and schools
